Psalm 86:13,15-17 (from The Message)

God will **never** quit on us or on any of his dear children. How wonderful that is to remember when I start to give the negative thoughts space. God snatches me from these thoughts - and surrounds me with tenderness and mercy. I feel immense gratitude, not only for God putting me back on the right path, but for all the helpers out there in hospitals, senior facilities, Lutheran Social Service and Cherish All Children, who are out there every day expressing the love of Christ to our most vulnerable, especially during these challenging times.

Lord, you help us and comfort us. You hear our prayers and You answer us. Lord, we ask that You be our strength, our shelter and our peace. Be with all those who are working every day to keep others safe and whole. Amen.
