

## Wednesday Prayer

24<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost – Changes of Seasons

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. 1 Thessalonians 5:1-5

I see a few final leaves falling outside my window, I hear the helicopter overhead again as news of the election results brings those who celebrate and those who protest together on the streets near where I live, and I feel the magnitude of the work ahead of us. The seasons are changing.

So as these seasons change, we will continue to work together to protect children and youth. We will carry the mission of Cherish All Children forward. We will engage more deeply in fighting against unjust systems through learning and partnering. We will share hope.

God of light and love, let our lights shine as we go through changes of seasons. Transform our weariness into action and our troubles into hope. Amen.
