

## Wednesday Prayer

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Lent – God created us for good

The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.

Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge.

There is no speech, nor are there words; their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world. Psalm 19:1-4

May we raise up women throughout modern history, and all who hear the cries of the oppressed and work for safe and just communities. Amen.
